# 2016

## Live from Giulești - multimedia project

As part of Bucharest's candidacy for the title of European Capital of Culture, we coordinated an urban art project alongside the Arena Association.

A team of artists worked with 19 children from the Giulești neighborhood, encouraging them to tell stories about life in their area.

This led to the creation of a comic strip, \*Where are you from? From Giulești!\* (by Alexandru Ciubotariu & Adina Popescu), two on-site murals (Pisica Pătrată), a photography exhibition (Roald Aron), and a video installation (BHM). 250 copies of the comic strip were donated to schools and libraries.

# 2017

## Noii Povestitori, 1st edition - first children's chapter book with Roma characters published in Romania

\*\*The New Storytellers\*\* is a project for children's literature creators who want to give voice to Roma characters. For the first edition, we organized 12 creative workshops with a group of children from the Alternative Education Club in Ferentari (CEA). Their stories were an inspiration and research source for \*The Story of the Lost Kendama\*, created by Adina Rosetti & Irina Dobrescu. 500 books were donated to 18 schools in the Teach for Romania network, two schools in Tulcea, and CEA.

In 2018, the book won the Romanian Writers' Union Award, youth section.

# 2018

## Mini-doză de grandoare - professional training for writers & illustrators

Together with \*Citim Împreună România\* (Reading Together Romania), we organized a seminar for 17 Romanian authors and illustrators. During these meetings, Jane G. Meyer, a children's book author and editor from Santa Barbara, conducted training on how to write picture books with texts under 1,000 words.

Project financed through an independent fundraising campaign.

# 2019

## Incubatorul de povești colorate, 1st edition - professional training for writers & illustrators and picture book contest

We organized a creative workshop between March 22–24, 2019, at the National Museum of Romanian Literature, for 22 writers and illustrators. The workshop was led by Michel Van Zeveren, a renowned Belgian children's book writer and illustrator.

We also organized a public panel discussion led by Brandi Bates (\*Citim Împreună România\*), where education and publishing professionals participated.

Following this workshop, we organized a competition, and the winning book, \*What a Surprise!\*, written by Simona Epure and illustrated by Georgiana Chițac, was published by Cartea Copiilor Publishing House. We donated 1,000 copies to kindergartens in the OvidiuRO network, where educators conducted literacy activities based on a guide we created.

## Noii Povestitori, 2nd edition - first picture book with Roma characters published in Romania

**\*\*New Storytellers\*\*** is a project for children's literature creators who want to give voice to Roma characters. For the second edition, we collaborated with writer Florin Bică and illustrator Anca Smărândache. They created an illustrated book, *\*Nanata\**, aimed at children aged 3 to 7. The book was launched in May 2020 in partnership with Cartea Copiilor Publishing House. 500 copies were distributed free of charge to kindergartens in the OvidiuRO network, along with an activity guide. Educators used the book and activities for at least two reading workshops.

The project was funded by a sponsorship (Alex Fund) and a fundraising campaign (Swimathon 2019).

## 2020

### Incubatorul de povești colorate, 2nd edition - professional training for writers & illustrators and picture book contest

Between February 14–16, 2020, we organized a creative workshop for 26 writers and illustrators at the National Museum of Romanian Literature. The workshop was led by Nadine Brun-Cosme, a well-known French children's writer.

We also organized a public discussion panel, led by Brandi Bates, where education professionals participated.

Following this workshop, we organized a competition, and the winning book, *\*Up the Stairs\**, written by Georgiana Chițac and illustrated by Oana Ispir, was published by Cartea Copiilor Publishing House. 750 copies were donated to kindergartens in the OvidiuRO network, along with a pedagogical guide. The digital version of the book is available on our website.

## Serious Fun - literacy program

Children from vulnerable backgrounds usually enter primary school with a learning gap, especially if they haven't attended kindergarten. Consequently, many of them do not learn to read and write in time. After an initial critical period, this gap widens rapidly as children fall behind and lose interest in school and self-confidence.

That's why we developed \*Serious Fun\*, a literacy workshop program based on illustrated books for second to fourth graders with reading and writing difficulties. Our goal is to bring them up to class level as quickly as possible. Due to the pandemic, the program was interrupted from March to June 2020 and resumed online for two months.

## Tot ce știu eu despre noi - education for diversity project

**\*\*Everything I Know About Us\*\***

This is a diversity education module aimed at students in grades 3–4 and 5–7, inspired by the \*Teaching Tolerance\* program and based on the curriculum developed by Julie Olsen Edwards and Louise Derman-Sparks (\*Anti-bias Education for Young Children and Ourselves\*). Children explore their identity, community, rights, and the power to act through a series of 14 lessons. Most of the lessons are based on illustrated books, and the activities are interactive and playful.

The project was implemented in partnership with Teach for Romania.



# 2021

## Povești pentru diversitate, 1st edition - education for diversity: teacher training & educational kit

This is a diversity education program aimed at teachers working with preschoolers, inspired by the \*Learning for Justice\* program and based on the curriculum developed by Julie Olsen Edwards and Louise Derman-Sparks (\*Anti-bias Education for Young Children and Ourselves\*).

### \*\*PROGRAM ELEMENTS:\*\*

- Training module for educators
- A series of 5 webinars on diversity education, covering: Introduction to diversity education; Ethnic identity & diversity ; Gender identity & diversity; Socioeconomic status & diversity; Family structure & diversity
- Classroom Educational Kit: 8 illustrated books and a pedagogical guide with 50 literacy, emotional education, and diversity activities.

The program was implemented in partnership with OvidiuRO Association, as part of the national reading encouragement program \*Read Me 100 Stories\*.

## Jocul emoțiilor - teacher training online workshops/SEL

This series of online workshops was coordinated by OvidiuRo Association. Weekly, we explored with psychologists and preschool teachers various contexts and methods for fostering the socio-emotional development of children in their first six years of life. Each monthly theme was presented by specialists and practitioners in four types of workshops, focusing on conceptual clarifications, pedagogical practices, illustrated books with pedagogical guides, or recommended activities for parents.

Our association was responsible for designing and delivering a monthly workshop, where we proposed an illustrated book appropriate to the chosen themes and a pedagogical guide with activities for kindergartens.

## Povești pentru drepturile mele - teacher training & educational kit

This series of webinars and reading workshops promotes the use of illustrated books in educating children about their rights. In collaboration with \*Citim Împreună România\* (Reading Together Romania), we bring together international and national specialists in children's rights education and cultural access for all.

Activities included:

- A 3-hour webinar led by Jonathan Todres, a specialist in children's rights and children's literature
- A 1-hour webinar led by children's author Nadine Brun-Cosme
- A 1-hour webinar led by Ruxandra Mateescu, founder of \*Supereroi printre noi\*, on making public reading events accessible to children with disabilities
- An online workshop on creating reading activities based on 15 selected illustrated books that address children's rights
- A public reading event organized in partnership with Kyralina Bookstore
- 20 reading workshops for approximately 200 children

We also created an educational kit on the use of illustrated books in children's rights education, which is available for free on our association's website.

The project is funded by a grant from the French Embassy in Romania / French Institute in Bucharest.

## Noii Povestitori/3rd edition - the first illustrated Roma history for children

This project is for children's literature creators who want to give voice to Roma characters. For the third edition, we worked with a creative team composed of Ioanida Costache & Petra Gelbart (writers), Anca Smărăndache (illustrator), and Petre Petcuț (historian). They created the first illustrated history of the Roma people aimed at children aged 8 and above, titled \*The Ring with the Horse's Head\*. The book was published in 2022 by Seneca Publishing. 450 copies were distributed free of charge to schools in the Roma Education Fund network. Teachers used the book and activities for at least two reading workshops.

## Cea mai dragă familie - diverse families picture book

### **\*\*My Dearest Family\*\***

This is a project aimed at diversity education. Written and illustrated by Georgiana Chițac, *\*My Dearest Family\** is an illustrated book for children aged 3 and above, helping them discover the diversity of family types that are representative of Romania. This self-published book is available for free in digital format on our association's website and will be included in the second edition of the *\*Stories for Diversity\** program. It is accompanied by a pedagogical guide with literacy and diversity education activities.

This editorial project was carried out in partnership with OvidiuRO Association.

# 2022

## Supereroii - picture book featuring characters with disabilities

### **\*\*Superheroes\*\***

This project aims to create an illustrated book featuring characters with disabilities. The book was created by children's writer Simona Epure and illustrator Anca Smărăndache and adheres to universal accessibility standards for people with disabilities. In September and October, the two authors held a series of workshops with a group of five children with neurocognitive and motor disabilities, along with five typical volunteers. The authors drew inspiration from the children's stories, drawings, and interactions, making the book grow organically, reflecting the children's universe and turning them into story heroes.

We donated over 1,000 copies, some of which reached children with disabilities or students training to work with people with special needs, while others went to typical children in kindergartens and primary schools.

## **ROMA S/HEROES, 1st edition - a series of 4 picture books about Roma personalities**

### **\*\*What Roma Role Models Do You Have?\***

How have their life stories influenced you? These questions were answered by 11 young Roma participants during the \*ROMA S/HEROES\* creative writing online workshops, held from February to March 2022.



Alongside journalist Delia Marinescu, writer Iulia Iordan, and a team of four illustrators (Oana Ispir, Georgiana Chițac, József Vass, and Ana-Maria Lemnaru), they created the first series of illustrated books for children aged 5 and up, featuring contemporary Roma personalities from Romania. The four illustrated books were printed in a run of 2,000 copies (500 copies per book) and were donated to schools in disadvantaged areas. In the kindergartens that received the set of books, young children will discover **\*ROMA S/HEROES\*** alongside their educators.

## Teen Action for Inclusion - workshops & game design featuring the rights of people with disabilities

### \*\*Teen Action for Inclusion\*\*

In response to persistent stereotypes about people with disabilities in our society, we facilitated five public meetings between 14 teenagers (both typical and with disabilities), followed by brainstorming workshops where they shared their experiences, challenges, and potential solutions.

Subsequently, we designed a game that presents the problems faced by people with disabilities and possible solutions. We trained 40 teachers, who used the game in their classrooms during social education lessons. The game is also shared on social media and can be accessed for free on our association's website.

## Incubator de povești colorate, 3rd edition - professional training for writers & illustrators and picture book contest

The theme of the 3rd edition of the Incubator was comics for preschool children and the 3 days professional training was held by Sergio Ruzzier, writer and illustrator of Italian origin, awarded with countless international prizes.

22 Romanian writers and illustrators had the opportunity to participate in the creative workshop and receive feedback from Sergio Ruzzier during three days, at the National Museum of Romanian Literature in Bucharest, between February 24 - 26, 2023.

After the training, we organized a contest for the participating writers and illustrators. The contest was won by illustrator Amandine Bănescu, who wrote & illustrated \*Oac si Tac\*.

We donated 3150 books to kindergartens and libraries.

A second edition of the book was published this year by Portocala Albastră Publishing House.

The project is co-financed by AFCN (National Cultural Fund Administration).

## Pași de povestași - co-writing project for teenagers

### **\*\*The Boy Who Wanted Nothing\*\***

This novella was written collaboratively by Iulia Iordan and 16 teenagers from Gălbinași, Călărași County, as part of the \*Storytellers' Steps\* project. The project is a literary journey, guided by an established writer and inspired by the children, with fragments from their universe, imagination, and aspirations.

For eight weeks, the 16 students from the middle school in Gălbinași participated in creative storytelling workshops led by Iulia Iordan, where they practiced the art of narrative and used their imagination to create stories inspired by their lives.

The project also includes a critical analysis by Mihai Iacob, an education researcher. Both this analysis and the novella [\\*The Boy Who Wanted Nothing\\*](#) are available for free in digital format on the association's website.

The project is co-financed by AFCN (National Cultural Fund Administration).

## BARE RROMA - a series of 4 picture books in bilingual version (Romanian/Romani)

### **\*\*Bare Roma for the Little Ones\*\***

Through the project *\*Bare Roma vaș le tikne éhavorre\**, we aim to translate four illustrated books featuring contemporary Roma personalities into a bilingual Romanian-Romani edition. These books were created with the support of our association, within the framework of the ROMA S/HEROES project, co-financed by AFCN in 2022.


We proposed this project following feedback from beneficiary teachers after nearly six months since the completion of ROMA S/HEROES. This project was a first for Romania and Europe, highlighting Roma personalities who serve as role models for children, regardless of ethnicity, and opening important discussions about values and diversity. These four books can easily be integrated as teaching materials by educators.

## ROZALBASTRU - teacher training & educational kit

In collaboration with two French associations, we explore the challenges of non-sexist education and best practices that could transform preschool pedagogy in Romania.

In a series of 4 webinars, our guests included: Bénédicte Fiquet (trainer, \*Association Adéquations\*); Andrew Matiasko (educator and trainer, \*Babilou\*); Laura Grunberg (writer and sociologist).

Out of the 2000 participants, we have randomly selected 20 teachers who received a mini-library of 12 illustrated children's books that address gender stereotypes in a way that is understandable to young children. These participants conducted at least one workshop on diversity and gender education using the project's pedagogical guide and one of the books they received.

# 2024

## BARE RROMA, 2nd edition - a series of 4 picture books about Roma personalities

This represents the second edition of the \*ROMA S/HEROES\* project, awarded in 2023 at the AFCN Gala and the Civil Society Gala. It is a literature-based education project that involves all actors in diversity education, from book creators to young readers. Under the guidance of writer Iulia Jordan and journalist Delia Marinescu, eight Roma students wrote four illustrated books about Roma heroes and heroines, contemporary personalities they selected.

The 4 bilingual Romanian-Romani books have been published and are being donated to schools in disadvantaged areas (4400 books). Approximately 11,000 children will benefit from these books, and the reading will be supplemented by pedagogical activities gathered in a specially created guide. About 1,000 teachers benefited from 2 online training workshops on diversity education and Roma identity.

The project is co-financed by AFCN (National Cultural Fund Administration).

## POVEȘTI PENTRU DIVERSITATE - 1st online video course of education for diversity in Romania

This course represents the first video course in Romania for preschool and primary school teachers, aimed at educating them in the field of diversity. The course addresses five key themes: disabilities, socioeconomic status, ethnicity, gender equality, and family, with an invited speaker for each theme: Professor Laura Grunberg; Professor Alexandru Zamfir; Ruxandra Mateescu, a specialist in disability rights; Andrea Chiru-Maga, psychotherapist; Vasile Brașovanu, teacher and educational counselor .

The course also includes numerous practical pedagogical resources, ready to be used in the classroom.

The platform hosting the \*Stories for Diversity\* course—<https://www.pentrudiversitate.org/>—was launched on September 6, 2024.

## BARIȘ. De vorbă cu ploaia

**\*\*"Bariș. Talking to the Rain"\*\***

This is an editorial project of an illustrated children's book aimed at children aged 5 and up. The book will be launched in November 2024 at the Cărturești bookstore. Written by Professor Alexandru Zamfir (Romani Language & Literature Department, University of Bucharest), the book is illustrated by Daniela Olaru.

The story introduces the main character, Bariș, a little boy of Roma ethnicity who must go inside the house because it starts to rain (the name Bariș is inspired by the Sanskrit and Romani word \*barish/bariś\*, meaning "rain"). The structure of the story develops through a dialogue between Bariș and the rain, which, through personification, becomes a central character alongside the boy. The dialogue incorporates elements of Roma history, culture, and language, starting with the Indian origin of the Roma people, an introduction to the main Roma groups with brief descriptions, and a focus on the contributions of Roma people to Romanian society and culture.

# AWARDS & INTERNATIONAL OUTREACH

## **The European Innovation Days in History Education/HISTOLAB, Bruxelles, martie 2023**

These are the main annual events organized by HISTOLAB, showcasing innovative ideas on how to improve or revolutionize the teaching of history across Europe. The event brings together history teachers, academics, researchers, practitioners, junior professionals, and students, all from the field of history education.

The first edition of the European Innovation Days in History Education took place from March 8–10, 2023, at the European Economic and Social Committee. We were among the 30 projects presented at this event, where we discussed two of our editorial projects: \*The Ring with the Horse's Head. The History of Roma People Told to Children\* and \*ROMA S/HEROES\*.

## **Meeting with a delegation of Swedish librarians /Bucharest, April 2023**

On April 19, 2023, we were invited to host a roundtable discussion for a delegation of seven Swedish librarians, alongside the manager of the National Library of Roma People from Sweden, Bagir Kwiek. The event took place at the National Museum of Romanian Literature, followed by an experience-sharing meeting and discussion of future projects, hosted by the Swedish Embassy in Bucharest.

## **AFCN Award, Social Inclusion & Cultural Dialogue Category\*\* / May 2023**

These awards are exclusively for non-governmental organizations and aim to bring examples of best practices in cultural production and promotion to the attention of the public and the cultural community at local and international levels.

At the AFCN Awards Gala, our ROMA S/HEROES project won the award for best project in the \*Social Inclusion & Cultural Dialogue\* category.

# AWARDS & INTERNATIONAL OUTREACH

## Second Place, Education & Learning Section, Civil Society Gala, XXI Edition/ September 2023

ROMA S/HEROES won second place in the \*Education & Learning\* category at the Civil Society Gala. It was one of the 238 civic initiatives, which included 182 projects, 23 programs, and 33 social campaigns implemented during 2021–2022.

The projects were evaluated by 85 specialists in project implementation and evaluation, researchers, sociologists, journalists, civil society leaders, non-profit sector representatives, and private sector leaders.

## Itsy Bitsy Gala Award, 2024

Gabriela Nenciu was awarded as one of the 2023 leaders in social inclusion, recognized for the impact of \*Bare Rroma\* and the projects initiated by the \*Cu Alte Cuvinte Association\* over the past seven years. CUAC has launched 19 illustrated books featuring characters that reflect the diversity of Romanian society, distributing over 20,000 free copies of these books in small communities, contributing to inclusive education through stories. Many of these books feature Roma heroes and heroines, ensuring that children from this significant minority in Romania are represented in literature.

## Country Catalog/Children's Books 2024-2025

Two of our books were selected to appear in the \*Country Catalog / Children's Books 2024-2025\*, which will represent Romania at international book fairs between 2025–2026. The selection was made following a call from the Ministry of Culture, in partnership with \*De Basm - Romanian Writers' Association for Children and Adolescents\*.





The two titles are:

- \*Nico's Bell\* (a story about the Roma activist Nicoleta Bițu, by Mirela Busuioc, Albert Morteau & Georgiana Vatală, illustrated by Oana Ispir / part of the Bare Rroma series);
- \*The Boy Who Wanted Nothing\* (collaboratively written by Iulia Iordan and 16 teenagers from Gălbinași, Călărași County, illustrated by József Vass)

The selection criteria for the 38 books chosen for the catalog were the value of the text, illustration, and book design, as well as the proposed book's potential to penetrate the international market.
